"As we celebrate the love and companionship pets bring to our lives, it's also a great time to check if their vaccinations are up to date, if they're protected from parasites, and if they're receiving a balanced diet that meets their needs," Mr Stapley said.

Animal medicines play a crucial role in maintaining animal health and wellbeing, supporting not only the pets we adore but also the broader community by reducing the risk of zoonotic diseases and ensuring a healthy environment for both pet and pet owner.

AMA, in our <u>2025 Election Priorities</u>, is calling on the next government to implement a nationally consistent companion animal policy. This includes:

 Investing \$8 million over 5 years towards establishing a coordinating committee comprising government, industry and community representatives to develop and implement a National Companion Animal Policy.
